The Emperor Penguin

The emperor penguin is the largest out of all of the different species of penguins. They are about 4 ft. tall and weigh from 70 to 90 lbs. These penguins live mostly in Antarctica. They live for about 20 years. On the ice, temperatures can drop as low as -140°F. The penguin's coat has three layers: the outer feathers, the inner downy feathers, and a layer of blubber. However, coats alone can't keep the penguins warm enough. Because of this, they stay in huddled groups for up to 9 weeks at a time. Imagine standing shoulder-to-shoulder with each of your classmates for over two months! The emperor penguin needs to get food from the water, so it must be a good swimmer. They can swim almost 10 mph and can dive to depths of over 900 feet.
