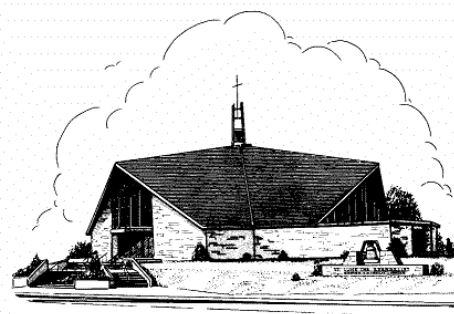

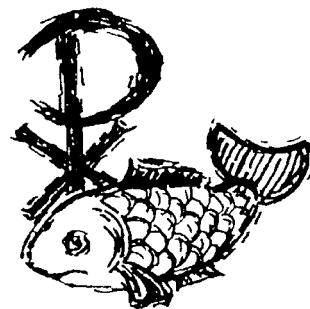

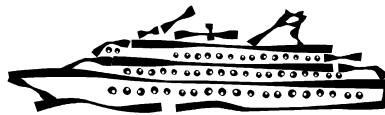

**This day in history:** James Otey Patterson was born 120 years ago on January 15, 1886.

He was the third pastor of St. Luke the Evangelist Parish, serving from 1939 to 1965.

Fr. Patterson had served at St. Luke immediately after his ordination in 1918 as he had been here as assistant rector

from July 1918 to March 1920 at which time he became secretary to Cardinal Dougherty. In December 1920 he was appointed to the faculty at St. Charles Seminary where he served until his appointment to St. Luke as Administrator and then Pastor. His only parish work was at St. Luke which he loved dearly.
