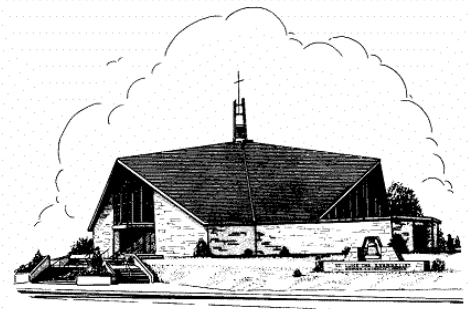

In 2007 Congress must reauthorize an omnibus piece of legislation known as the Farm Bill, which sets U.S. policy in key areas that affect domestic farmers and food producers, domestic food consumers, and farmers in developing countries.

Did you know that the Farm Bill is passed only every 5 years. Some have suggested that it be called the Food Bill so it would get the attention of more people.

will work towards policy priorities for the 2007 Farm Bill including:

- Strengthening and increasing investment in policies that promote conservation and good stewardship of the land

- Providing transitions for farmers to alternative forms of support that are more equitable and do not distort trade in ways that fuel hunger and poverty

- Protecting the health and safety of farmworkers

- Expanding research related to alternative and renewable forms of energy

- Providing direct food aid efficiently and effectively to hungry people in other nations
