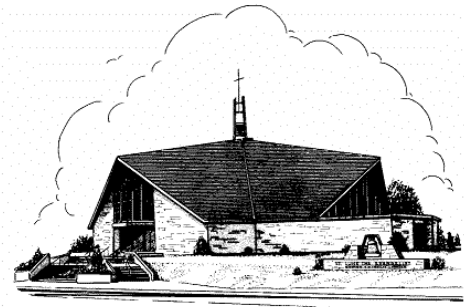

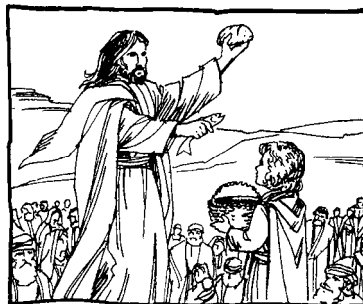

ST. JOHN'S HOSPICE

St. John's Hospice is located in Philadelphia at 1221 Race St. The Archdiocese has operated the Hospice since 1963 to help inner-city homeless men. St. John's feeds a hot meal to over 500 men each day. It also provides temporary living quarters for 39 men where they can shower, shave, and experience the comfort of a clean bed in a safe and caring surrounding. The Hospice provides counselors to help the men with the causes of their homelessness and works to help them correct their problems. There are health professionals to attend to minor health problems and there is an eleven-bed facility for men with serious medical problems.

FATHER'S DAY GIFTS

On **June 16 & 17** we are collecting gifts of toiletry and clothing articles for the men cared for at St. John's Hospice.

Suggested toiletry items are: disposable razors, deodorant, toothpaste, soap, toothbrushes, hand and body lotion, Kleenex, foot powder, wide-tooth combs, Vaseline and washcloths. Please do not give anything with alcoholic content, such as mouthwash or aftershave lotion. Suggested clothing items are white athletic socks and underwear. Don't wrap the gifts.

PARISH DONATION DAY

Donations of food (casseroles), clothing, toilet articles, and simple medical supplies (aspirin, cold tablets, band aids, etc.) are needed and welcome for the Hospice. The parish Donation Day is the **third Monday of each month (June 18 this month)**. Drop off at 213 Cliveden Avenue, Glenside, before 10am

Casseroles pans can be picked up in the rear of Church. There are simple recipes there and on our website (www.stlukerc.org/casseroles.htm). Some of the recipes require no cooking, some require very little cooking. (Baking is done at St. John's Hospice.) Please freeze and put your Name - Parish - Month & Year on top of pan.
