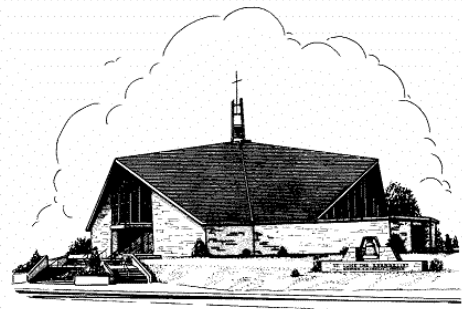

## WEB SITE OF THE WEEK

The Pennsylvania Catholic Conference (PCC) is the public affairs arm of Pennsylvania's Catholic bishops and the Catholic dioceses of Pennsylvania. There are 10 Catholic dioceses in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Eight are Latin Rite dioceses (Archdiocese of Philadelphia, and Dioceses of Allentown, Altoona-Johnstown, Erie, Greensburg, Harrisburg, Pittsburgh, and Scranton), fully contained within the Commonwealth. Two are Byzantine Rite dioceses with Apostolic Sees in Philadelphia (Ukrainian Catholic Archeparchy of Philadelphia) and Pittsburgh (Byzantine Archeparchy of Pittsburgh). ## CALL TO ACTION: AN INTERFAITH PERSPECTIVE

This year’s **Glenside Interfaith Dialogue**, “Call to Action” will engage the audience and panelists from the Jewish, Christian, and Muslim faith traditions in three weeks of dialogue about the roots, realities, and possibilities of social justice work in and among these faith communities.
