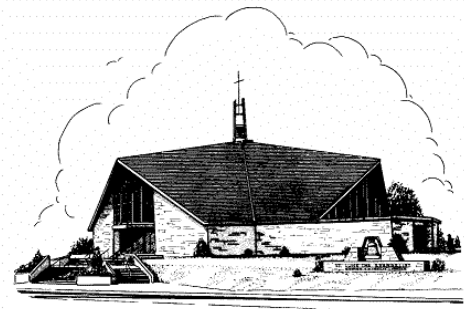

They urge the Catholic Church to become a community of hope and help for marriages and to join others in building a culture of marriage. Weaving together the Catholic faith tradition and its pastoral practice, the data of social science, and the experience of married couples, the NPIM will offer guidance and resources, including a pastoral letter, in order to promote, strengthen, sustain, and restore marriages.

CATHOLIC CAMPAIGN FOR HUMAN DEVELOPMENT

Since its start thirty-seven years ago, the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) has worked to transform lives and communities, focusing steadily on breaking the cycle of poverty in thousands of communities across the United States.

CCHD was established by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops with a two-fold mandate to fund low-income controlled empowerment projects and to educate Catholics about the root causes of poverty within the context of the Catholic social tradition. CCHD programs are funded through an annual collection in parishes each year.

AMAZING RACE FOR GRACE *Celebrating Faith, History, and Eucharist*

GENUARDI'S 10% BACK TO SCHOOL PROMOTION

School is just out and there are already plans for a 'Back to School' promotion!

The **Genuardi's 10%** Back to School promotion **starts on July 18 and ends on September 5**. So if you are Genuardi's shopper and are not already in the e-scrip program please sign up soon.

Usually if you use your Genuardi's Club Card and are signed up to the escrip program our programs for the youth of the parish receive

- 1% on monthly purchases between \$0 - \$400;
- plus 2% on monthly purchases between \$400 - \$600;
- plus 3% on monthly purchases between \$600 - \$750.

(Here's how it works: If your monthly purchases totaled \$650, your donation earned would be \$9.50. $\$400 \times 1\% + \$200 \times 2\% + \$50 \times 3\% = \9.50 . If you spend that same \$650 in August, the parish groups will receive \$65.00.)

CALL TO ACTION: AN INTERFAITH PERSPECTIVE

This year’s **Glenside Interfaith Dialogue**, “Call to Action” will engage the audience and panelists from the Jewish, Christian, and Muslim faith traditions in three weeks of dialogue about the roots, realities, and possibilities of social justice work in and among these faith communities.
