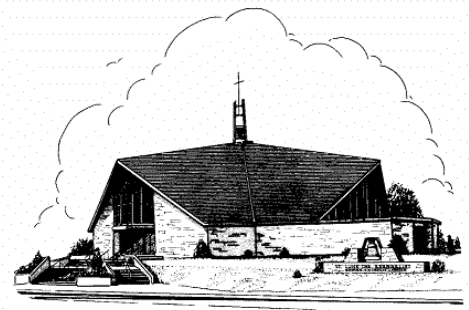

From Gospel John 3:14-21

Reflection:

a servant. "For God so loved the
