**REFLECTION ON
PENTECOST**

From John 20:19-23

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jewish authorities, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you....As the Father has sent me, so I send you."

Reflection:

Fear can have power over us and keep us from attempting any change at all in our lives; afraid to let go of what we know and have adapted to, for what is untried and unknown. The disciples behind locked doors were gathered in fear. But Jesus' gift of the Spirit freed them to unlock their lives and take their faith in the risen Lord into the world with courage.

TITLES OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

692 When he proclaims and promises the coming of the Holy Spirit, Jesus calls him the "Paraclete," literally, "he who is called to one's side," ad-vocatus. "Paraclete" is commonly translated by "consoler," and Jesus is the first consoler. The Lord also called the Holy Spirit "the Spirit of truth."

693 Besides the proper name of "Holy Spirit," which is most frequently used in the Acts of the Apostles and in the Epistles, we also find in St. Paul the titles: the Spirit of the promise, the Spirit of adoption, the Spirit of Christ, the Spirit of the Lord, and the Spirit of God - and, in St. Peter, the Spirit of glory.
