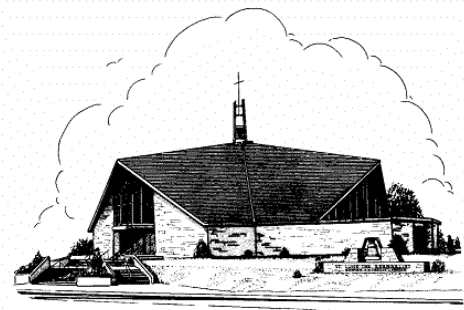

REFLECTION IN THE 12TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

From Mark 4: 35-41

The disciples woke Jesus and said to him, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" He woke up, rebuked the wind and said to the sea, "Quiet! Be still!" The wind ceased and there was a great calm.

Reflection:

There is much that affects our church these days: scandal on the inside and rejection and persecution from the outside. With the disciples we are tempted to ask Jesus, "Don't you care....?" Today's gospel directs us to turn to Christ, who cares for God's storm-tossed children and ask him to speak a word of calm over the powerful forces that distress us "Quiet! Be still!"

We ask ourselves:

What turbulent forces in my life frighten me and test my faith?

Have I invited Jesus to speak a word that will give me courage and inner calm?

PARISH RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM

The Parish Religious Education Program (PREP) is for students who attend public schools or who are home-schooled and are in grades 1 through 8. **Registration is on-going through June 30.** The fees are \$90 for 1 child, \$150 for 2 children, \$200 for 3+ children. As of July 1st fees increase to \$105 for 1 child, \$165 for 2 children, \$215 for 3+ children.

New registrants should supply a copy of the child's Baptismal Certificate. Forms may be picked up in the back of Church or at the Rectory.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (our Montessori-based nursery school) is now accepting registration for the fall. Forms are in the baskets in the back of Church.

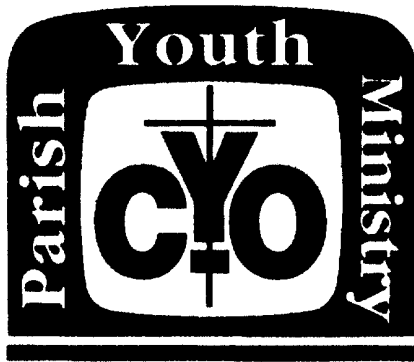

Household items needed by families include fans, tables, love seats (easier to move than full length sofas), baby equipment and supplies, DVD players (useful for learning English).

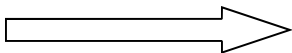

SAFE ENVIRONMENT PROGRAM

They are required to have a Pennsylvania State Police Criminal Record Check and receive a Pennsylvania Department of Public Welfare Child Abuse History Clearance. Also they must attend Safe Environment training and agree to the Standards of Ministerial Behavior and Boundaries.

Leaders of organizations must see that their volunteers comply with the requirements.

Volunteers may not be actively involved in parish activities with children until all documentation is complete and in the rectory office.

THEOLOGY OF THE BODY

July 27 to 30, 7 pm to 9:30 pm
Archbishop Wood High School

All adults high school age and older are invited to a four night mini-seminar on Pope John Paul II's scriptural reflection on the human person and human love known as the *Theology of the Body*. Understanding the Theology of the Body will bring clarity to the confusion that surrounds today's popular misunderstanding of the place of human sexuality.
