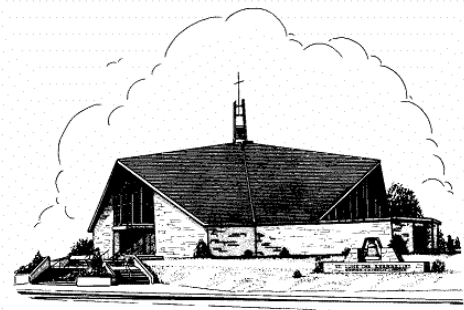

SAFE ENVIRONMENT PROGRAM

All adults who work with children in parish programs must comply with all the Safe Environment Program requirements. They are required to have a Pennsylvania State Police Criminal Record Check and receive a Pennsylvania Department of Public Welfare Child Abuse History Clearance. Also they must attend Safe Environment training and agree to the Standards of Ministerial Behavior and Boundaries.

Leaders of organizations must see that their volunteers comply with the requirements.

Volunteers may not be actively involved in parish activities with children until all documentation is complete and in the rectory office.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In Pope Benedict XVI's encyclical *Deus caritas est*, our Holy Father wrote that "within the community of believers there can never be room for a poverty that denies anyone what is needed for a dignified life."
