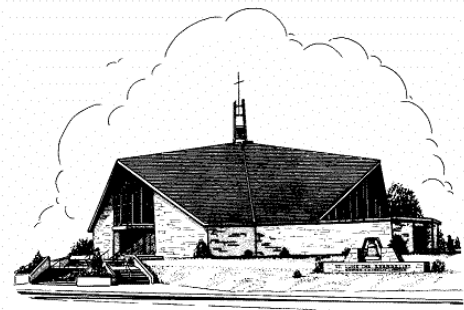

## REFLECTION ON 16TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

*From Mark 6:30-34*

When Jesus disembarked and saw the vast crowd, his heart was moved with pity for them, for they were like sheep without a shepherd; and he began to teach them many things.

### **Reflection:**

Teaching was the first response Jesus made to the needs he saw among the people who came to search him out. He knew their most basic needs, for they had a desire for wisdom that only he could provide them. What about us? Are we on the right path or are we drifting all over the place? The Shepherd is ready to provide us the necessary food for our journey – wisdom. That's why we gather each week at Eucharist: to receive that Wisdom in the Word and the Meal we share.

### **We ask ourselves:**

**Which wisdom guides our most important decisions -- the world's or Jesus'?**

**To what sources does our search for wisdom take us?**

## QUESTION OF THE WEEK

*I will appoint shepherds for them who will shepherd them so that they need no longer fear and tremble.*

Jeremiah 23:4a

**In this "Year of the Priest," what priest do you recall most fondly as having been a shepherd for you?**

Charity is at the heart of the Church's social doctrine. Every responsibility and every commitment spelt out by that doctrine is derived from charity which, according to the teaching of Jesus, is the synthesis of the entire Law (cf. Mt 22:36-40). It gives real substance to the personal relationship with God and with neighbour; it is the principle not only of micro-relationships (with friends, with family members or within small groups) but also of macro-relationships (social, economic and political ones). For the Church, instructed by the Gospel, charity is everything because, as Saint John teaches (cf. 1 Jn 4:8, 16) and as I recalled in my first Encyclical Letter, "God is love" (*Deus Caritas Est*): *everything has its origin in God's love, everything is shaped by it, everything is directed towards it.* Love is God's greatest gift to humanity, it is his promise and our hope. - Pope Benedict XVI, *Caritas in Veritate* (2)

## KENTUCKY SERVICE TRIP

Ten young people from Bishop McDevitt High School in Wyncote PA participated in the **Brothers of Charity Christian Service Week** June 21-27 in the Appalachian Mountains, working at St. Vincent Mission in David, Kentucky. *St. Luke parishioners Patrick Doyle, Jim Dwyer, Kate Hober, and Wallace Weaver* were joined by Morgan DiNardo, Kevin Moran, Derek Muller, Bill Richter, Jeff Seidl, and Phil Yesenosky as part of a group of ten accompanied by Brother John FitzGerald FC, Miss Ellen Poliwoda (McDevitt faculty) and Mr. James Gallagher.

During the week they assisted in completely stripping, wrapping and re-siding additions on a small home; strengthening, painting and relining the soffit; repairing a corner section of existing siding, re-installing aluminum awnings and in-

stalling new gutters and downspout. Additionally they worked on clearing some trails, digging and graveling several drainage ditches, cutting grass and weeds and assisting with the construction of another porch deck as well.

They also had the opportunity to see firsthand the coal process and the ecological results of strip mining and to begin to understand the complex issues it presents to the people of Appalachia. The end of the week allowed some time to enjoy the musical heritage of Kentucky bluegrass and local forms of music.



The entire week was framed in the spirituality of St. Vincent De Paul (after whom St. Vincent Mission is named) and Father Peter Triest,

founder of the Brothers of Charity (who was called the 'Vincent DePaul of Belgium'). The trip honors the late Brother Matthew Burns FC who established the Mission in 1968. He was a McDevitt teacher before leaving for Kentucky and shepherded many student volunteers from McDevitt during the first years. Some members of the group are also volunteers at Triest Hall in Laverock, a home for men with developmental disabilities run by the Brothers of Charity.

**RESPECT LIFE THOUGHT: A Consistent Ethic of Life**

A wide spectrum of issues touches on the protection of human life and the promotion of human dignity. As Pope John Paul II has reminded us: *“Where life is involved, the service of charity must be profoundly consistent. It cannot tolerate bias and discrimination, for human life is sacred and inviolable at every stage and in every situation; it is an indivisible good”* (*The Gospel of Life*, no. 87).

“Among important issues involving the dignity of human life with which the Church is concerned, abortion necessarily plays a central role. Abortion, the direct killing of an innocent human being, is *always* gravely immoral (*The Gospel of Life*, no. 57); its victims are the most vulnerable and defenseless members of the human family. It is imperative that those who are called to serve the least among us give urgent attention and priority to this issue of justice” (2001: US Bishops’ Pastoral Plan for Pro-life Activities: *A Campaign in Support of Life*).
