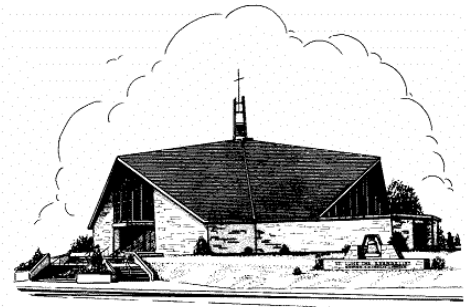

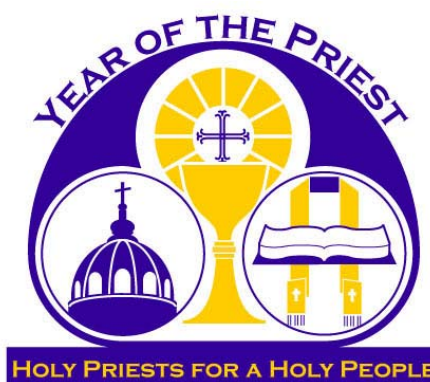

The Church does not have technical solutions to offer and does not claim "to interfere in any way in the politics of States." She does, however, have a mission of truth to accomplish, in every time and circumstance, for a society that is attuned to man, to his dignity, to his vocation. Without truth, it is easy to fall into an empiricist and skeptical view of life, incapable of rising to the level of praxis because of a lack of interest in grasping the values — sometimes even the meanings — with which to judge and direct it. Fidelity to man requires *fidelity to the truth*, which alone is the *guarantee of freedom* and of *the possibility of integral human development*. For this reason the Church searches for truth, proclaims it tirelessly and recognizes it wherever it is manifested. This mission of truth is something that the Church can never renounce. Her social doctrine is a particular dimension of this proclamation: it is a service to the truth which sets us free. Open to the truth, from whichever branch of knowledge it comes, the Church's social doctrine receives it, assembles into a unity the fragments in which it is often found, and mediates it within the constantly changing life-patterns of the society of peoples and nations. - Pope Benedict XVI, *Caritas in Veritate (Charity in Truth)* (9)

REFLECTION ON THE 24TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

From Isaiah 50:5 – 9a

The Lord God is my help, therefore I am not disgraced. I have set my face like flint, knowing that I shall not be put to shame.

Reflection:

Doing the right thing doesn't guarantee we'll succeed. It's not about success, but about being faithful. But how can we be faithful when suffering is the price we sometimes must pay for doing what is right? What will keep us from yielding and turning in another direction? Isaiah has a piece of wisdom and assurance for us today, "The Lord God is my help, therefore I am not disgraced."

We ask ourselves:

Have I ever suffered or been penalized for doing what was right?

What gave me the determination and strength to stay the course?

SAFE ENVIRONMENT PROGRAM

All adults who work with children in parish programs must comply with all the Safe Environment Program requirements.

They are required to have a Pennsylvania State Police Criminal Record Check and receive a Pennsylvania Department of Public Welfare Child Abuse History Clearance.

REMEMBER:

The Child Abuse Clearances are mailed to individuals' homes. These clearances must be brought to the rectory.

Also they must attend Safe Environment training and agree to the Standards of Ministerial Behavior and Boundaries.

Leaders of organizations must see that their volunteers comply with the requirements.

Volunteers may not be actively involved in parish activities with children until all documentation is complete and in the rectory office.

The parish will offer Safe Environment Training on Wednesday, October 7, at 7 pm. Please contact the rectory to register.
