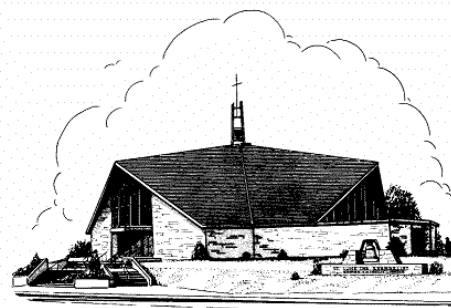

From Mark 10: 46-52

Jesus said to the blind man in reply, "What do you want me to do for you?" The blind man replied to him, "Master, I want to see."

Reflection:

Jesus placed a potent question to Bartimaeus, "What do you want me to do for you?" It is a question he asks us now, do you hear it? It's an invitation to believe, and trust the promise that if we ask for vision and insight to guide our lives, we will get it. Maybe quickly – most usually, over the course of our lives – day by day, one step at a time, little by little.

We ask ourselves:

What is there in my life that I have been avoiding or unwilling to look at?

Where or to whom can I go for insight, so that I can make the changes I need to for a healthier and more spiritual life?

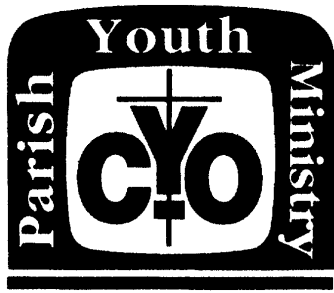

These words are in my heart and mind as I celebrate my golden jubilee as a Sister of St. Joseph. A time of jubilee is a good time to survey all that has happened during the passing years, to view the joys and sorrows, the ups and downs that make a life. As I do this, I am filled with awe at God's faithful love. During the last fifty years, I have experienced the joy of living in a community of women who share my values and work with their eyes fixed on the mission that we as Sisters of St. Joseph espouse: to try, as far as we are able and to encourage one another and those with whom we work, to live our vision: to stand with marginalized persons and to treasure and care for our Earth. But the core of our life as Sisters of St. Joseph is contemplation. To see God in all things and to let God's movement in our lives lead us to respond as Jesus did is our goal. Our mission of unity, rooted in Jesus' desire "that all may be one," propels us to find ways to work at reconciliation in our every day settings and to make choices that will affect our world.

My work in education at the elementary school level and now as a college professor of physics at Chestnut Hill College as well as my interest in the integration of science and religion has helped me to come to know God in new and exciting ways. My relationships with faculty, students, and their families have enriched my life. I am particularly grateful for the opportunity I had to minister for eight years in the Philippines where I taught at the Jesuit Ateneo de Manila University encouraging students to become scientists and engineers at the service of their country. I was also blessed to have both the time and the opportunity to visit on weekends, along with some of my students, people who lived in a slum area near the university. I will always be grateful for the chance to be immersed in another culture, to have lived in this interesting country and to have experienced its growth as a nation.

I am encouraged by the growing number of women and men in the SSJ Associates in Mission as well as the young women who have recently joined our Mission Corps to live out with us our mission of unity. My hope is that today many more young women will be attracted to this mission and will decide to become Sisters of St. Joseph. It's a wonderful life!

CATHOLIC BISHOPS OF PA ISSUE FLU SEASON DIRECTIVES

Catholic Bishops of Pennsylvania direct the following for the celebration of the Sacred Liturgy and for flu prevention:

The distribution of the Precious Blood for the faithful is generally suspended. The faith of the Church teaches that Christ, whole and entire, is received even under only one species.

The exchange of the sign of peace is to be offered without any physical contact. If the priest celebrant chooses to extend the invitation for the sign of peace, the faithful, instead of a handshake, may bow to the persons nearby.

These directives issued by Catholic Bishops of Pennsylvania became effective Sunday, October, 18, 2009.
