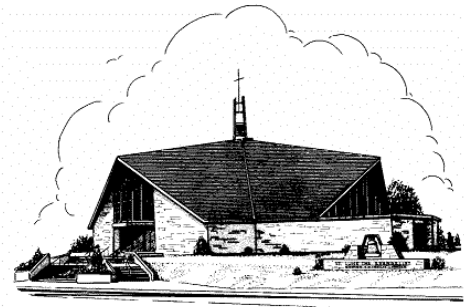

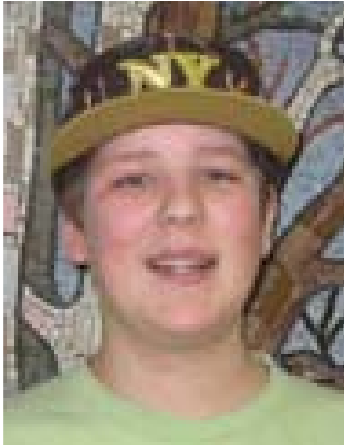

**HEARTS AND HANDS
QUILTERS**

A BRIEF HISTORY: 1999-2009

A decade ago, a group of women from our local churches – St. Paul’s Lutheran, Carmel Presbyterian, Glenside UCC, Glenside/Abington United Methodist, St. David’s R. C. – as well as St. Augustine’s R. C. in Bridgeport and Redeemer Lutheran in Pennel – set up their sewing machines in Father Fitzpatrick Hall at St. Luke’s on April 11, 1999. We had an ambitious goal: to make 50 quilts for the refugees in Kosovo. And we did it!

Sewing for people who needed our love and the comfort that only a handmade quilt can bring turned out to be such a rewarding experience that the women decided to form a charity quilt group. Thus *Hearts and Hands* was formed, with a mission to help the homeless, the hurting, the poor, the suffering and the dying among us.

CELTIC BLUES

Hearts and Hands, an ecumenical charity quilting group, has given St. Luke Church a high-quality quilt, in gratitude for the welcoming space provided in Father Fitzpatrick Hall, where the group has been meeting since the Kosovo crisis 10 years ago.

The quilt, “Celtic Blues,” measures 68” x 78” with a centerpiece of a framed Celtic knot on point inside framed rectangles and five borders. It comes with a pillow sham and throw pillow. The quilt is machine pieced and machine quilted and carries an appraisal value of \$975. The appraisal was made by a certified appraiser of the American Quilter’s Society in Paducah, KY, who awarded an “excellent” rating for both the quilting and condition. Her embossed documentary papers will accompany the quilt.

“Celtic Blues” was on exhibit recently at the Keystone Quilt Show in Quakertown. Judges described the quilt as “...excellent balance and proportion...excellent quilting stitch...block on point creates dimension.”

The quilt was given to our pastor “for fundraising for whatever may be needed at St. Luke Church.” Msgr. Flood has honored the mission of *Hearts and Hands* by choosing our sister parish in Haiti as the beneficiary of the quilt raffle.

Tickets are \$1 each, six for \$5. They may be returned in the offering basket for the next five weeks. Additional tickets may be purchased at the rectory. They will also be sold by members of the Peace and Justice Committee after all the Masses, **December 5 & 6**, the weekend before the drawing.

The winning ticket will be drawn in FFH on **December 13**, at 12:30 pm. Michelle Massaro, who designed and stitched the quilt, will be present, along with other members of *Hearts and Hands*.
