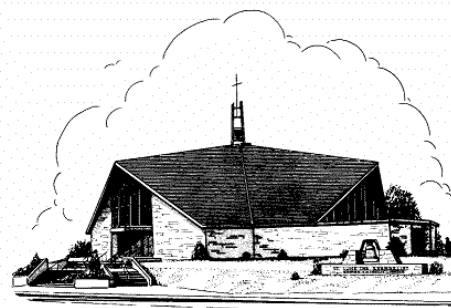

BLESS THE BABY JESUS DEVOTION

The Mass for the Second Sunday of Advent Sunday, December 6, 2009, at 11 am, in the Cathedral Basilica of Saints Peter and Paul will be followed by the fifth annual Bless the Baby Jesus devotion, and will be a wonderful opportunity for families to grow in faith as the “domestic church.” Pope Benedict XVI has said, “May all families strive to imitate [the Holy Family’s] faith, hope and charity, so as to bear greater witness to the singular importance of the ‘domestic church’ for the life of the universal Church and for society.”

The Family Life Office and Catholic Social Services are planning this event with great care, to provide a morning of joyful prayer in the spirit of the Advent season. This year, instead of a prayer service, the event will be celebrated flowing from the Mass at the Cathedral’s regular 11 am Mass time. This will allow more people and families to attend and to celebrate the Eucharist together.

At the conclusion of the Mass, Cardinal Rigali will bless the statues and images of the Baby Jesus that families bring. Families can then carry the image of Jesus back home, to inspire their prayers and to contemplate His birth.

This occasion will also be an opportunity for people to assist the less fortunate. There will be baskets available to collect infant clothing for local crisis pregnancy centers and to collect canned food for the poor.

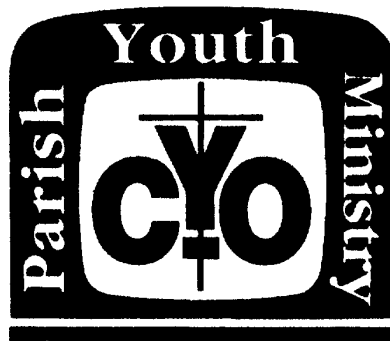
