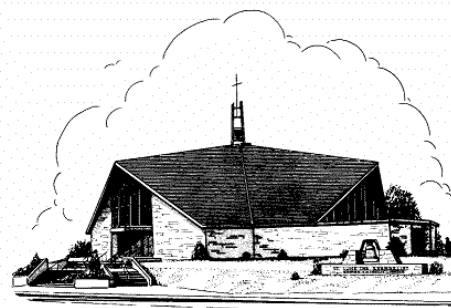

**REFLECTION ON 5TH
SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

From Luke 5:1-11

Peter said to Jesus, "Master we have worked hard all night and have caught nothing, but at your command I will lower the nets."

Reflection:

"We have worked hard all night and have caught nothing..." Like Peter we have things that concern us and keep our minds preoccupied during the night. We have: struggled to keep a relationship together, only to have it crumble; tried to support our families during these times of cutbacks; taught our children the faith, only to have them give it up when they left the house; come towards the end of our hard-working lives to find ourselves limited by physical or financial constraints, etc. With Peter and his partners, we have a lot on our minds and have much to preoccupy us.

We can use some help to keep us focused and to guide our decisions. In the midst of all that occupies us we want to continue hearing Jesus' invitation to follow him. We especially want to do that as we toil through the sometimes, very dark periods of our lives.

We ask ourselves:

What areas of my life consume my energies and concern me the most?

Have I considered how Jesus is inviting me to follow him in those very places?

SAINT LUKE SCHOOL REGISTRATION FOR THE 2010-2011 SCHOOL YEAR

The following guidelines will assist you in being prepared for your child’s registration.

Kindergarten children must be five years of age and First Graders must be six years of age by September 10th. No exception is made regarding this Archdiocesan and school district age requirement. The following documents are required at the time of registration: an original birth certificate, Baptismal certificate (unless baptized in Saint Luke the Evangelist Parish), and complete immunization records. You should also have the names and phone numbers of two emergency contacts, the name and phone numbers for your child’s physician and

dentist and a \$75 non-refundable registration deposit.

We encourage a full day Kindergarten program, but we are happy to discuss half-day program arrangements at the time of registration.

NB: Parents with students already attending Saint Luke School should also call the school to schedule registration appointments for their new Kindergarten or First Grade child.

Sister Parish Status

Our sister parish has begun the education of refugee children from Port-au-Prince. We have just heard that the banking system is now functioning in Haiti.
