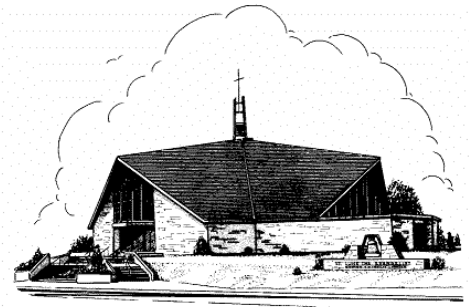

REFLECTION ON SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

From Luke 9: 28b-36

Jesus took Peter, John and James with him and went up onto a mountain to pray... And behold, two men were conversing with Jesus, Moses and Elijah, who appeared in glory and spoke of his exodus, that he was going to accomplish in Jerusalem.

Reflection:

Luke's account of the transfiguration event is the only one that includes the necessity of the passion on the journey to glory. To share in the glory of Jesus, disciples must walk the journey of Jesus: offer their very lives for the sake of others.

Lent gives us an opportunity to do what Jesus and his disciples did: come apart to spend time in prayer, reflection and listening. Then, strengthened and guided by prayer, we will move on to the next stage of our journey with trust that God will nourish us each day of our "exodus."

We ask ourselves:

When it comes to listening to Jesus, how hard of hearing am I right now?

What quiet space can I open up for myself this Lent to listen to God's voice?

What "journey" or change in my life am I being invited to make?

Keep our sister parish, Notre Dame de la Presentation, in Los-Palis Haiti in your prayers.

Registration for the 2010 - 2011 school year will begin in February! Registration appointments will take place each Tuesday morning and Thursday afternoon. You may make a registration appointment by calling the school office: 215-884-0843.

The following guidelines will assist you in being prepared for your child's registration.

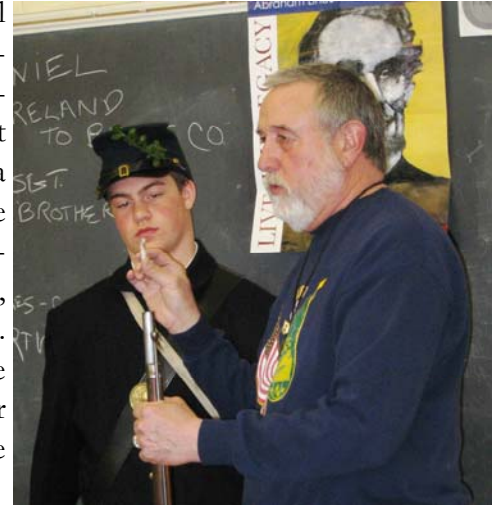
Kindergarten children must be five years of age and First Graders must be six years of age by September 10th. No exception is made regarding this Archdiocesan and school district age requirement. The following documents are required at the time of registration: an original birth certificate, Baptismal certificate (unless baptized in Saint Luke the Evangelist Parish), and complete immunization records. You should also have the names and phone numbers of two emergency contacts, the name and phone numbers for your child's physician and dentist and a \$75 non-refundable registration deposit.

We encourage a full day Kindergarten program, but we are happy to discuss half-day program arrangements at the time of registration.

NB: Parents with students already attending Saint Luke School should also call the school to schedule registration appointments for their new Kindergarten or First Grade child.

FAMILY CONVERSATIONS

Second Sunday of Lent

Gospel Highlight: Luke 9:35—
“Then from the cloud came a voice that said, “This is my chosen Son; listen to him.””

Key Idea: The Gospel account of the Transfiguration conveys both the awe and the fear the disciples must have experienced before the vision of their transfigured Lord. But it is the voice from the clouds that teaches them the meaning of their experience. They are in the presence of the Son of God, who shows them the way of life. The disciples are given a foretaste of the victory of Jesus’ death on the Cross in the glory of his Resurrection, just as we mark this Lenten season in the knowledge of Jesus’ glorious Resurrection. As disciples of the transfigured Lord, our lives too are to be transformed. This is the Lenten journey of conversion, our daily path of turning from self-love to love of God and others.

Take 30 (Seconds): Reflect or pray in silence.

Share: How is each family member striving to hear God’s word more attentively this Lenten season? What does daily conversion mean to you—individually and as a family? Who in the community are you called to support as they progress in their journeys of conversion—catechumens, returning Catholics, new members of the parish?

Pray: *(Repeat each phrase after the leader.)* “The Lord is my light and my salvation. / The Lord is my life’s refuge; of whom should I be afraid? / Wait for the Lord with courage. / Wait for the Lord”
