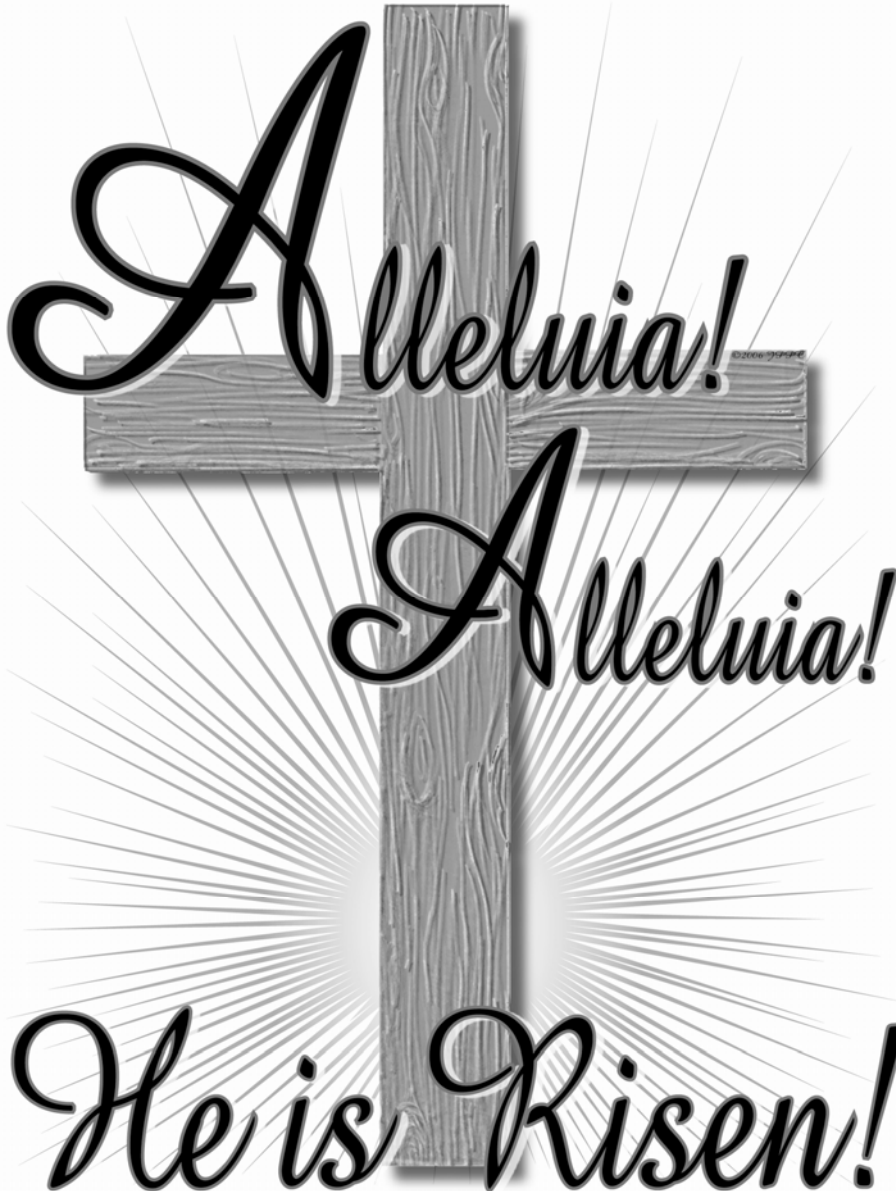

Easter Sunday

Gospel Highlight: John 20:8—
“Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed.”

Key Idea: The Resurrection of our Lord is the central mystery of Christian faith. It is also the central hope of daily human existence. With the Resurrection we can be certain that suffering and death is not the final word on the human condition. This is the deepest source of Christian hope. And it is the wellspring of true Christian joy. On Easter Sunday God’s Word bursts forth in a joyful hymn of praise as the Church resounds with Alleluias. Our Lenten observance now finds its fullest meaning. As the message of Easter resounds in our minds and hearts, the truth of Jesus’ Resurrection finds echo in our lives. Christ is risen, he is risen indeed! Alleluia!

Take 30 (Seconds): Reflect or pray in silence.

Share: How has our reflection on God’s Word during Lent prepared us to celebrate the Lord’s Resurrection? Name one personal hope and one family hope that is renewed in light of the event of Easter. Have each family member share how he or she will continue to reflect on the meaning of the Lord’s Resurrection throughout the Easter season.

Pray: (*Repeat each phrase after the leader.*) Alleluia! Alleluia! / The Lord is risen as he said. / He lives now to lead us to the fullness of hope and joy in God. / Alleluia! Alleluia!

**SAINT LUKE SCHOOL
REGISTRATION FOR THE
2010-2011 SCHOOL YEAR**

Registration for the 2010 - 2011 school year is in progress. Registration appointments will take place each Tuesday morning and Thursday afternoon. You may make a registration appointment by calling the school office: 215-884-0843.

The following guidelines will assist you in being prepared for your child's registration.

Kindergarten children must be five years of age and First Graders must be six years of age by September 10th. No exception is made regarding this Archdiocesan and school district age requirement. The following documents are required at the time of registration: an original birth certificate, Baptismal certificate (unless baptized in Saint Luke the Evangelist Parish), and complete immunization records. You should also have the names and phone numbers of two emergency contacts, the name and phone numbers for your child's physician and dentist and a \$75 non-refundable registration deposit.

We encourage a full day Kindergarten program, but we are happy to discuss half-day program arrangements at the time of registration.

NB: Parents with students already attending Saint Luke School should also call the school to schedule registration appointments for their new Kindergarten or First Grade child.

Sacrament of Baptism. Except during Lent, parish celebrations of Baptism are usually held during the 9:30 am Mass on the first Sunday of the month and at 1:00 pm on the other Sundays. Parents should attend the Pre-Baptismal Program (held once a month) before the day of Baptism. Call the rectory to register.

Sacrament of Marriage. All wedding preparations should be made at least 6 months in advance of the expected date of marriage. All engaged couples should attend a Pre-Cana Program early in their engagement. Please call the rectory to make these arrangements.

New Parishioners. Welcome to our Parish Family! To register call or visit the rectory to make arrangements. For information on becoming Catholic, call Jeanne Kyle at 215-572-0128.

Moving? If you are moving within the parish please let the rectory know of your new address. If you are moving from the parish, please let us know so we can say 'Good bye' & 'God go with you.'
