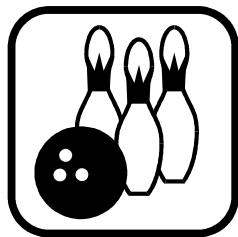


**Youth Group

Remembering Karl Rahner at 100

Rahner was a great Catholic theologian of the twentieth century and one of the primary architects of the documents of the Second Vatican Council. Chestnut Hill College is commemorating him this fall. They are offering three public lectures by President Emeritus of Georgetown University, Leo O'Donovan, SJ, Ph.D., a former student and now a renowned scholar of Karl Rahner, SJ.

**Genesis Revisited
Follow-up of Summer Series**

On Sunday, October 24, and Sunday, November 7, both weeks from 7:30 pm to 9:00 pm at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Glenside, we have an opportunity to spend some time together as Christians taking inventory of what we heard during this summer's Glenside Ministerium Genesis Series and discussing how it informed and enriched both our perceptions of the other faith traditions and our own faith.

The Genesis series was a profoundly important event on many levels and it would be valuable to reflect, as a Christian community, on what it meant to us and where it leads us as a community of believers.

If you attended the summer series and plan to attend this follow-up, you are invited to ponder these questions and (if you are willing) discuss them on October 24:

- What new things did you discover about other faith traditions during the Genesis dialogues?
- What new things did you discover about your own faith tradition during the Genesis dialogues?
- What important things did the Genesis dialogues affirm that the Christian, Muslim, and Jewish faiths share in common?
- What important differences between the Christian, Muslim, and Jewish faiths were apparent to through the Genesis dialogues?
- In what ways was your own faith challenged by the dialogues?
- In what ways was your own faith deepened by the dialogues?
- What was the most meaningful part of the dialogues for you?

The grand finale will be on Sunday, December 4, 2005. There will be an **Anniversary Mass** celebrated by Cardinal Rigali at 3:00 pm followed by a dinner at the Fort Washington Expo and Conference Center.

A **concert series** is in the works. Right now we have four dates scheduled:

Dec. 12, 2004—Handel's Messiah performed by the Chestnut Hill Orchestra

Jan. 9, 2005—Concert by Voces Novae et Antiquae

Feb. 20, 2005—Jazz performed by the Eric Mintel Quartet

On April 24, 2005, we will have an Art Auction. Not all of our plans are in the arts or on Sundays! We are planning a work camp trip to West Virginia, June 7-11, 2005. (See other notice in bulletin and our web site for more information.) A series on the Second Vatican Council is being planned. And this is just the beginning of our plans.

A primary way of celebrating our anniversary is by making sure that our *Dreams 2005* do come true. Over the next year we will focus on these *Dreams* and review what we have accomplished and see what still needs to be done. Keep our *Dreams* alive. Make our *Dreams* a reality.

Dreams 2005

We gathered the dreams of the parish by asking everyone to complete this sentence: ***It would be marvelous and a great blessing for St. Luke the Evangelist Parish if someday....***

Then everyone had the opportunity to indicate to which of those dream themes they had a strong commitment. (There were 7,350 strong commitments.) At an assembly we reviewed the dreams and developed some goals for the top ten dream themes. At a parish assembly in early April, 2001, we reviewed the goals and selected the top goals of the parish, our *Dreams 2005* goals. We want to be able to say, by our 100th anniversary in December 2005, that:

We have vibrant, multi-faceted **youth and young adult groups** for ages 14-18, 18-25, and 25-40. There is important interaction among groups.

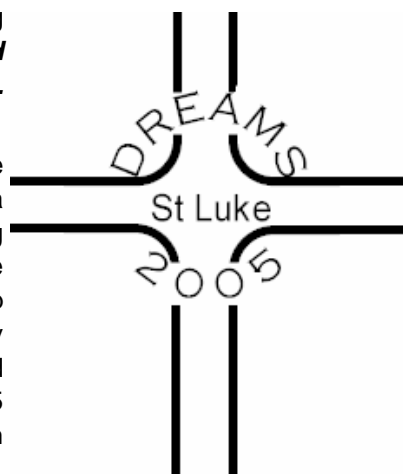
We have a strong identity as a "**Church Family**," current members recognize it; new members are welcomed and soon become part of it. We recognize that we all have needs and we can meet others needs.

We are a **caring community** that addresses needs in our own parish (including spiritual and social programs for developmentally delayed people and support for those with mental health issues) and we have strong outreach programs (including programs for the homeless, released prisoners, and currently incarcerated people).

We are a parish that is strongly committed to social **justice** issues, locally, nationally, internationally.

We have an active ministry to all the **children** in the parish which promotes a strong sense of unity among them, including a range of religious education opportunities (for example, Summer Bible School).

We recognize the necessity of active **Evangelization**, especially among Catholics. We work on this through a variety of methods, including liturgy, adult faith formation (education), and other aspects of all the goals of *Dreams 2005*.
